

# **Installation Guide**

## Down Post for M Series and VHM Arms

The purpose of this guide is to describe the procedure for attaching down post to Arm.

## **Parts Reference**


The following parts and hardware will be used in this procedure (see photos for parts, hardware not shown):

Item #	Description	Qty
1	Down Post	1
2	10-32 x 3/8" Socket Head Cap Screw (SHCS)	3
3	5/32" Hex Wrench	1

**Tools Required:** 5/32" hex key (provided).


## M Series Arm - Down Post Attachment

- 1. Remove plastic bolt cap from Swivel Cup (front end of the arm).
- 2. Using the 5/32" hex wrench provided, fasten Post to Swivel Cup with three (3) 10-32 x 3/8" SHCS as shown below.




# VHM Arm - Down Post Attachment

Installation Note: This installation kit is for a 2003 and later model VHM Arms only. A pre-2003 VHM Arm is not equipped with a Swivel Cup that allows attachment of the Down Post. For pre-2003 VHM Arm applications, call GCX Customer Service at (800) 228-2555. Refer to the illustration on the right for identification of a pre-2003 VHM Arm.



# Attaching Down Post to VHM Arm (2003 and Later Models)

- 1. Remove plastic bolt cap from Swivel Cup (front end of the arm).
- 2. Using the 5/32" hex wrench provided, fasten Post to Swivel Cup with three (3) 10-32 x 3/8" SHCS as shown below



#### **Routine Maintenance**

Periodically inspect all fasteners associated with the mounting assembly. Tighten or Adjust as necessary for optimal operation and safety.

## **Cleaning the Mounting Assembly**

- 1. The mounting assembly may be cleaned with most mild, non-abrasive solutions commonly used in the hospital environment (e.g. diluted bleach, ammonia, or alcohol solutions).
- 2. The surface finish will be permanently damaged by strong chemicals and solvents such as acetone or trichloroethylene.
- 3. Steel wool or other abrasive material should never be used.
- 4. Damaged caused by the use of unapproved substances or processes will not be warranted. We recommend testing of any cleaning solution on a small area of the mounting assembly that is not visible to verify compatibility.
- 5. Never submerge or allow liquids to enter the mounting assembly. Wipe any cleaning agents off the mounting assembly immediately using a water-dampened cloth. Dry the assembly thoroughly after cleaning.
